This Board of Management was inaugurated in December 2015 and will serve a four year term of office. We meet on the second Tuesday of every month with the exception of June and July. On occasion extra meetings may be necessitated.

The school year 2016 / 17 was a very busy one. After long negotiations and planning the joint project between the Junior & Senior School finally got the "go ahead" Our thanks go to all those who worked determinedly, patiently and constructively to get the project off the ground.Mr. Gerry King, (Principal Senior School) our now retired Principal Mr. Bryan O'Reilly, Acting Principal Ms. Maria O'Dwyer and the team at Fitzgibbon Mc Ginley Architects . If everything goes to plan our Special Education Needs Unit should be open for September 2018. Please see Principal's Report for a detail of the construction and the architectural drawings in the hall.

At the end of May the Board received a letter of resignation from Mr. Bryan O'Reilly. With great sadness and regret his resignation was approved. For almost 20 years Mr O'Reilly was the Principal and CEO of the school. His dedication and commitment was immeasurable. He worked hard at ensuring the children in his care were given every opportunity to be, in his own words "their best selves" He was a lover of language literacy and numeracy and all his decisions were child centered. He knew each of the 423 children by name and interacted with them on the yard, in the corridors and in the classrooms. He was happiest taking assembly or indeed anytime he got back into the classroom. He was ably assisted by the school staff whom he held in very high esteem and respect. We thank him sincerely for all his dedicated work. He has left a great legacy and a huge void.

Prior to his resignation and during his absence Ms.Eileen Hill and Ms Maria O'Dwyer shared the role of Acting Principal. On behalf of the Board I want to extend our gratitude to them both. The transition has been smooth and the usual high standards maintained. Indeed to all the staff tremendous credit is due. Change, though difficult was embraced. Sincere thanks to one and all.

A Selection Panel has been approved by The Patron Bishop Nulty. The vacancy has been advertised and the interview process will commence shortly to find a suitable successor. As soon as the appointment is made the parent body will be informed. In the meantime Maria O'Dwyer continues the role of Acting Principal assisted by Eileen Hill Deputy Principal.

Budget Management

Despite the political perception that our economy is on the up and up, austerity still reigns in education. Managing the school budget requires meticulous and constant auditing and accounting. We as a Board are very fortunate to have James Crudden, Chartered Accountant as our treasurer. On examination of the financial report you will see the transparent accounting. Each month James completes a variance analyses and adapts the budget according to our expected income and expenditure. He then presents the accounts in a concise and intelligible way. A Board of Management is not allowed to have a bank overdraft and careful budgeting is compulsory and at times a very onerous exercise. My sincere thanks to James for his time expertise and scrutinous financial eye.

Requisite Payments

Budgeting is an essential and difficult part of all our lives. Primary school budgeting is no exception. The government fall very short of providing an adequate capitation fee for the children in its care. If it were not for the Requisite Payments paid by parents the school income would be much less. In conjunction with School Fundraisers organised by The Parent Council we have the resources to provide extra to the children in our care. Additional income is sourced by hiring our hall in the evenings. This exercise is taken not out of greed but basic need. It entails additional work for our office staff, Noreen & Margaret and I applaud them for the time they spend in this capacity demonstrating their entrepreneurship. I thank you very sincerely for your continued support in supporting the Requisite Payments.
